Sec.8-3-8 Refuse from Outside the Village.

It shall be unlawful to bring refuse from outside the Village of Merrillan limits into the Village limits for disposal unless specifically authorized by written agreement with the Village.

Also **NO** dumping of any chemicals in the sewer system that may harm the system. This will only lead to higher costs of treatment and damage to the environment.

County Supervisor Report:

The county portion of your property taxes should be much less in 2024. The county mil rate was reduced from 0.589% to 0.508%. This means property taxes will drop by \$81.08 for every \$100,000 of home value. There are multiple reasons for this reduction. New construction and inflation have caused the equalized value of property within the county to increase by nearly \$300 million, which reduces the property tax rate. Our county has also done well to generate revenue from other sources. Most county revenue comes from grants, county services, and products. For example, 18% of revenue comes from state highway maintenance funds and grants, 20% from behavioral health services, 12% from family support & public health services, and 8% from forestry income. The county continues to pay down debt from the courthouse expansion and the health and human services buildings, which reduced our debt servicing cost by over \$300,000. For our \$37 million budget in 2024, less than 1/3 (approximately \$11 million) had to be funded by the property tax levy. The portions of the budget with the largest increases were the Sherriff's office and jail budgets. Overall, this is good news for property taxpayers in 2024, but keep in mind that the county tax is only a portion of your property tax. The village of Merrillan and the school district also levy tax on your property.
